Recently two ICA staff visited NZIS India branch and they were reminded about the Positive profile applications. Below is the list that they are using as their criteria selection process.

- 1/ Good academic record
 - 2/ IELTS score of no lower than 5.5 or completion evidence of higher English study.
 - 3/ Immediate family financial funds. Evidence must be shown.
 - 4/ Two family guarantors.
 - 5/ Financial evidence of guarantors.
 - 6/ Proof of regular source of income of guarantors.
 - 7/ Relevant study choice of study which should link to work experience that is connected to your study plan.
 - 8/ Demonstrated career progression opportunities.
 - 9/ Clear health and character requirements.
